

EMOTIONAL

- → Symptoms of depression (sadness, lack of emotions, etc.)
- → Symptoms of anxiety
- → Irritability, anger or impulsivity
- → Loss of interest in regular activities
- → Hopelessness

COGNITIVE

- → Difficulty concentrating
- → Incoherent or confused speech
- → Lack of motivation
- → Memory loss

BEHAVIOURAL

- → Behavioural changes (sleep, diet, activities, relationships, alcohol consumption or drug use, etc.)
- → Person suddenly appears relieved or happy even though their problems haven't been solved
- → Isolation
- → Neglected appearance or hygiene
- → Giving away belongings
- → Sudden interest in suicide and ways to take one's own life
- → Writing a suicide note

MESSAGING

- → "Soon you'll have some peace and quiet. I'll be out of your hair."
- → "I'll never get through this."
- → "I don't want to do this anymore."
- → "You'd be much better off without me."
- → "Life's not worth living."
- → "I want to kill myself."
- → "I'm going to kill myself."
